



Craft Supplies Organizer

Materials list:

- Tissue Box
- Wallpaper remnant
- Paper tubes (5)
- Scissors, pencil & clear tape
- Stick Glue
- Hot glue gun

Directions:

1. Cover your work surface with a plastic drop cloth or newspapers (we reused a shower curtain liner to protect our table).



2. Choose a tissue box with a pattern or design that you like or matches your décor and coordinates with your leftover wallpaper (tissue boxes are very decorative these days!). Remove the plastic paper on the opening.
3. Cut the top diagonally toward the corners and fold down the top flaps you created and tape them down. This gives you a neat edge and adds strength to the overall box.
4. Using the box as a pattern, draw out the box dimensions on the backside of the wallpaper. This **+**-shaped cutout will become the inside liner of your box. Place it in the box and trim away any excess paper before gluing. If you plan on doing

more than one box, use the final trimmed piece to create a pattern on a piece of boxboard (large cereal box). The boxboard pattern will make it easier to trace the pattern onto another sheet of wallpaper.

5. Cover the inside portion of the wallpaper that will be glued to the bottom with stick glue (it helps to keep the box as dry as possible). Place in position in the box and smooth down. Fold each side down and add glue then smooth into position.
6. Use your paper tubes to cut out enough wallpaper to go around the outside of the paper tube.
7. Use stick glue to attach the wallpaper to the outside of each tube.
8. The stick glue does not work as well on the outside of the wallpaper so use the hot glue gun to attach the five tubes to one side of the box. Remember to place the tubes so that the seams are hidden against each other.

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
