Not In The Garbage!

In order to prevent any further pollution of our local water supplies, wildlife and air quality, it is very important to keep hazardous/toxic chemicals out of our ecosystem. Sounds like a complicated task for the average homeowner - but the solution is really quite easy - simply drop off toxic materials/products at our Household Chemical Drop Off Depot. When toxic products are disposed of improperly (i.e. as litter or poured down storm drains or kitchen sinks), they have the potential to "leach" into the ground, become airborne, or contaminate our local watersheds. Toxins can be absorbed through the air we breathe, the water we drink, and our skin. But what many residents don't realize is this:

Many commonly used products that we encounter DAILY in our homes are considered very TOXIC to our ecosystem, when they are disposed of improperly.
(ie. household cleaners, paints, pesticides, etc.).

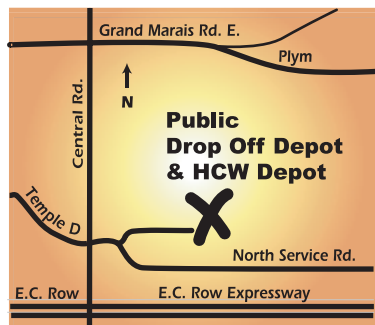
These products are known as household chemical waste (HCW). Not only are they hazardous to the environment, but they also pose significant risk to humans and wildlife. The Consumer Product Safety Commission reported that 150 common household chemicals have been linked to allergies, birth defects, cancer and psychological abnormalities.

It is extremely important for all homeowners to remember that once they are finished with a household chemical product, the **"leftover or unused portion" should NEVER be thrown in the garbage, poured down the kitchen sink or a neighbourhood storm drain.**

Please consider carefully the products that you are purchasing. It is preferable to buy "environmentally-friendly" products or use safer alternatives. If you have to purchase chemical products, please use them up completely, or drop off the unused portion at our HCW Depot. There is no charge for this service - we will dispose of the hazardous materials in the proper manner.

We accept the following materials at our HCW Depot (see sidebar).

There are two HCW Depots in Essex County. One is in Windsor (Public Drop Off Depot) and the second facility (Transfer Station #2) is in Kingsville.

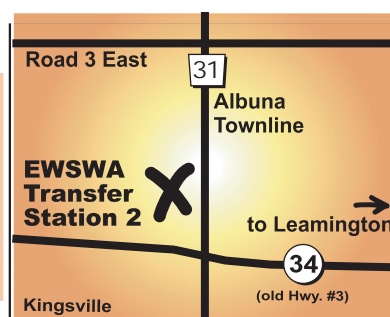
