Garden Gold Compost



Ingredients: Leaves, grass clippings, garden waste, brush, tree trimmings, shrubs (grown in Essex-Windsor), and paper.

The material is shredded, and composted at 55° Celsius (to kill pathogens and weed seeds) for three to six months, and screened to 1.27 cm (1/2") diameter.

Our compost passes the Compost Quality Alliance Analysis of the Composting Council of Canada.

This compost **exceeds** the Compost Quality Alliance guidelines.

Maturity Index: 8 - Inactive, highly matured compost, very well aged, possibly over-aged, like soil; **no limitations for usage.**

Possible Uses: Remediation, soil amendment, landscaping, planting media, turf establishment & top dressing, greenhouse seeding, greenhouse establishment, field nursery, agricultural soil amendments, potting soil.

Organic Matter: 64.55%, pH: 8.0%, Moisture: 44.20%, Carbon to Nitrogen Ratio 15:1

*****Maximum application of compost should not exceed 3kg/m² once per year*****

Existing Flower Beds: Add compost as a top dressing. If adding mulch, apply compost first, then cover with mulch. If last year's mulch is still in place, remove it, add a layer of compost, then reapply the mulch. Water until the entire root zone is saturated.

New Beds: Add compost and mix to existing soil. Although compost is beneficial whenever it is added to soil, for the best results, add your compost about 4 weeks before planting. This will give the compost some extra time to boost the level of beneficial organisms in your soil, energizing plant growth.

Vegetable Gardens: Apply compost as a top dressing, either before or after planting. Again, for best results, apply the compost at least 4 weeks before planting. You can also put a bit of compost in the hole you make when you plant your seedlings.

New Lawns: Apply compost and mix thoroughly and uniformly before you sod or seed your lawn. Water thoroughly. As with gardens, you will get the best results if you apply the compost at least 4 weeks before seeding.

Established Lawns: Aerate the entire area before topdressing. Rake compost evenly over the area. Water thoroughly. For best results, apply in early spring or fall.

Mulching Around Trees: Choose a coarse-textured compost to reduce weeds and provide a thick cover to the area. Blend compost to wood chip mulch. For best results, apply in early spring or fall. Always arrange the mulch so that water flows away from the tree trunk.

Tree Planting: Dig a hole about 5 times the diameter of the root ball of the tree. Before planting, mix compost and original soil thoroughly outside of the hole. Place the tree in the hole and use the compost-soil mixture as backfill around the root ball. Water thoroughly. For best results, apply a compost-wood chip mixture as a mulch around the tree (see above).

WARNING: The sodium content in compost may be harmful to some sensitive plants so, check plant labels carefully prior to planting. Never apply compost while it is still hot - as it can damage plants.
