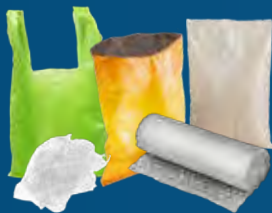

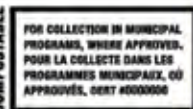

- **Park:** Green Bin 30 centimetres from curb/street
- **Point:** Arrows toward street
- **Space:** 1 metre away from other objects or containers

Leamington Garbage Collection

Leamington residents receive weekly garbage collection. Please review the urban and rural garbage collection maps to determine your collection day.

As per the Municipality's Waste Management By-law, residents must follow these guidelines when disposing of garbage:

- **Timing for Disposal:**

Garbage should be placed curbside the night before or no later than 6:00 AM on collection day.

- **Acceptable Containers:**

Garbage must be placed in acceptable containers and is limited to no more than four bags or pails per household. Containers must not exceed a weight limit of 20 kilograms (45 pounds) to ensure the safety of waste collection personnel.

- **Large Items and Furniture:**

A maximum of two large items, such as box springs, mattresses, carpets, toilets, couches, chairs, etc., can be disposed of curbside on your regularly scheduled garbage day. However, white goods require special arrangements for pickup.

- **Placement Regulations:**

Garbage must not be placed in a manner that impedes or obstructs pedestrian or vehicular traffic or interferes with municipal maintenance operations.

Violations to the Waste Management By-law may result in a clean-up charge and/or fine. Residents are encouraged to familiarize themselves with these regulations to avoid penalties. For more information, visit leamington.ca/Garbage.

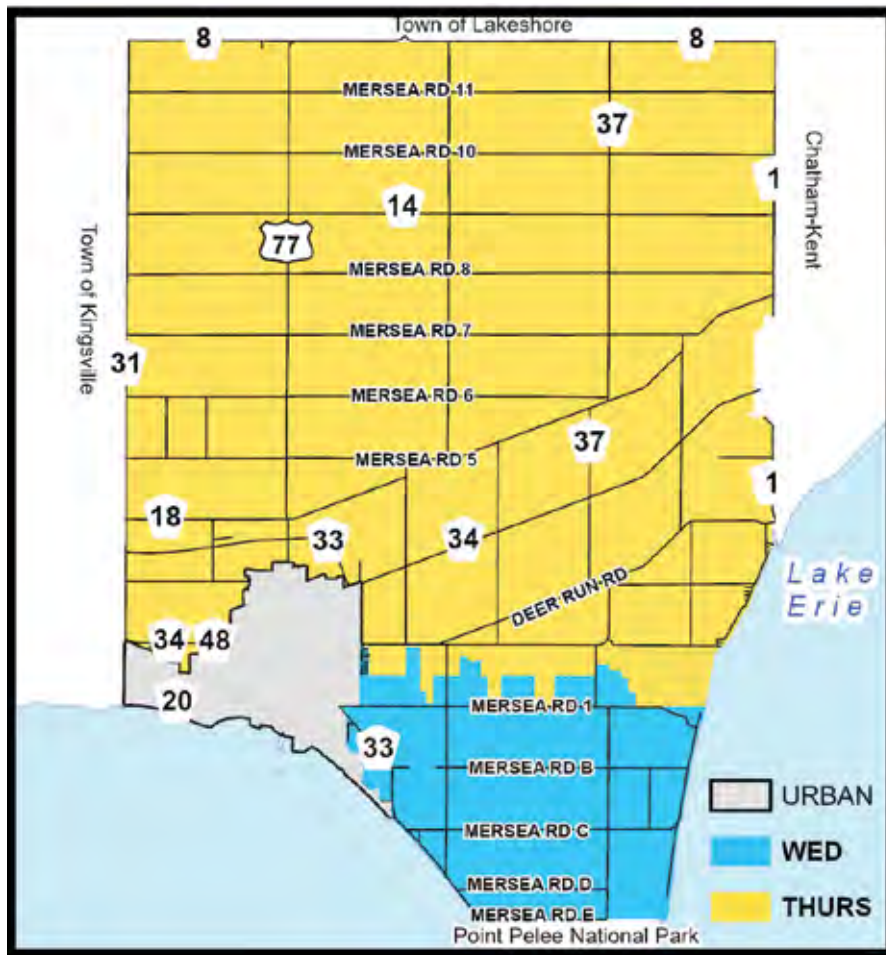


Non- Collectable Waste:

Waste that is deemed non-collectable includes: Ammunition, animal carcasses, animal waste, appliances, automotive parts, bricks, combustibles, chemical waste, computer equipment, concrete, construction and demolition waste, explosives, industrial waste, liquid waste, medical waste, metal items, pallets, paint products, renovation debris, syringes, televisions, and tires. These items are not garbage and will not be collected. Check the index for Public Drop-Off information.

White Goods / Metal Items / Old Appliances:

Collection is provided on the third Tuesday of each month. You must call the Municipality at 519-326-5761 at least one week in advance to arrange for pick up. There is no charge for this service.

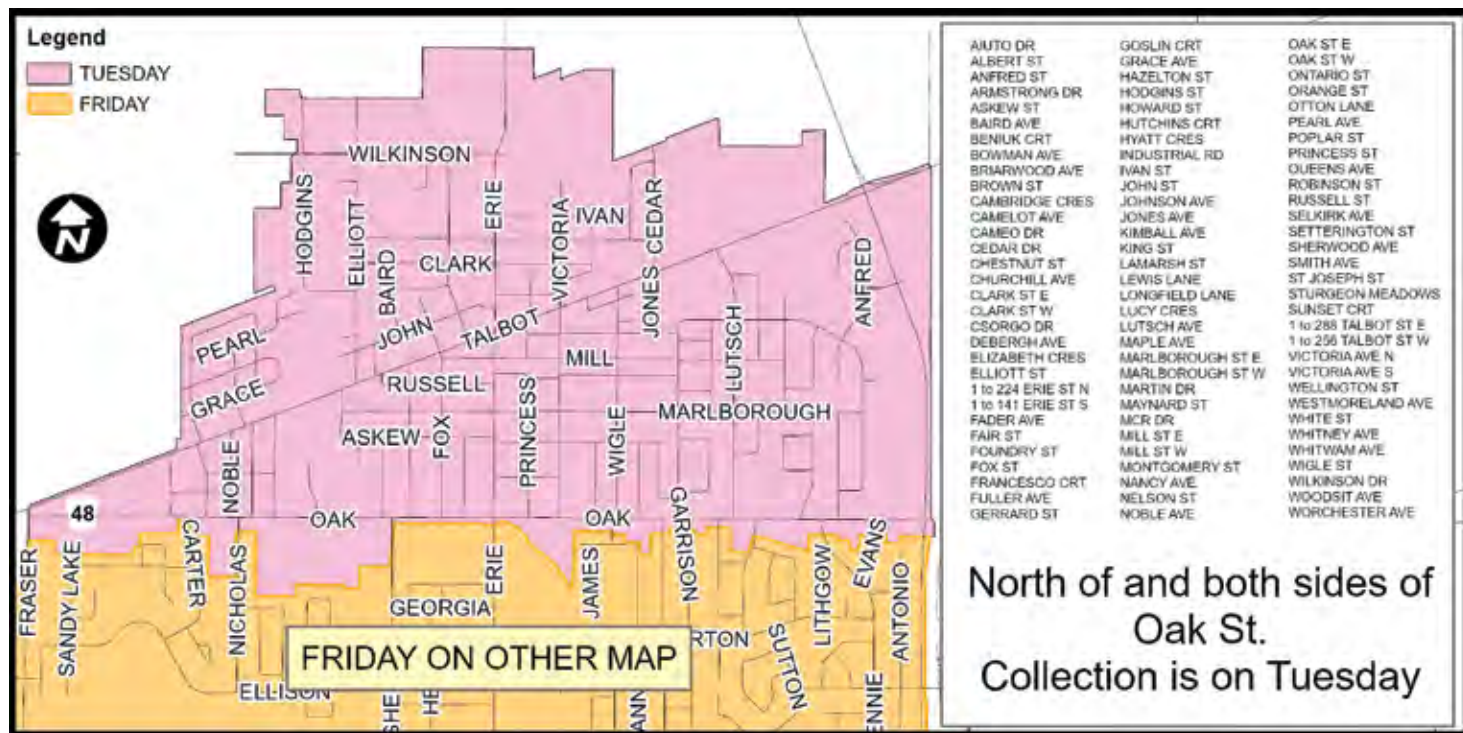

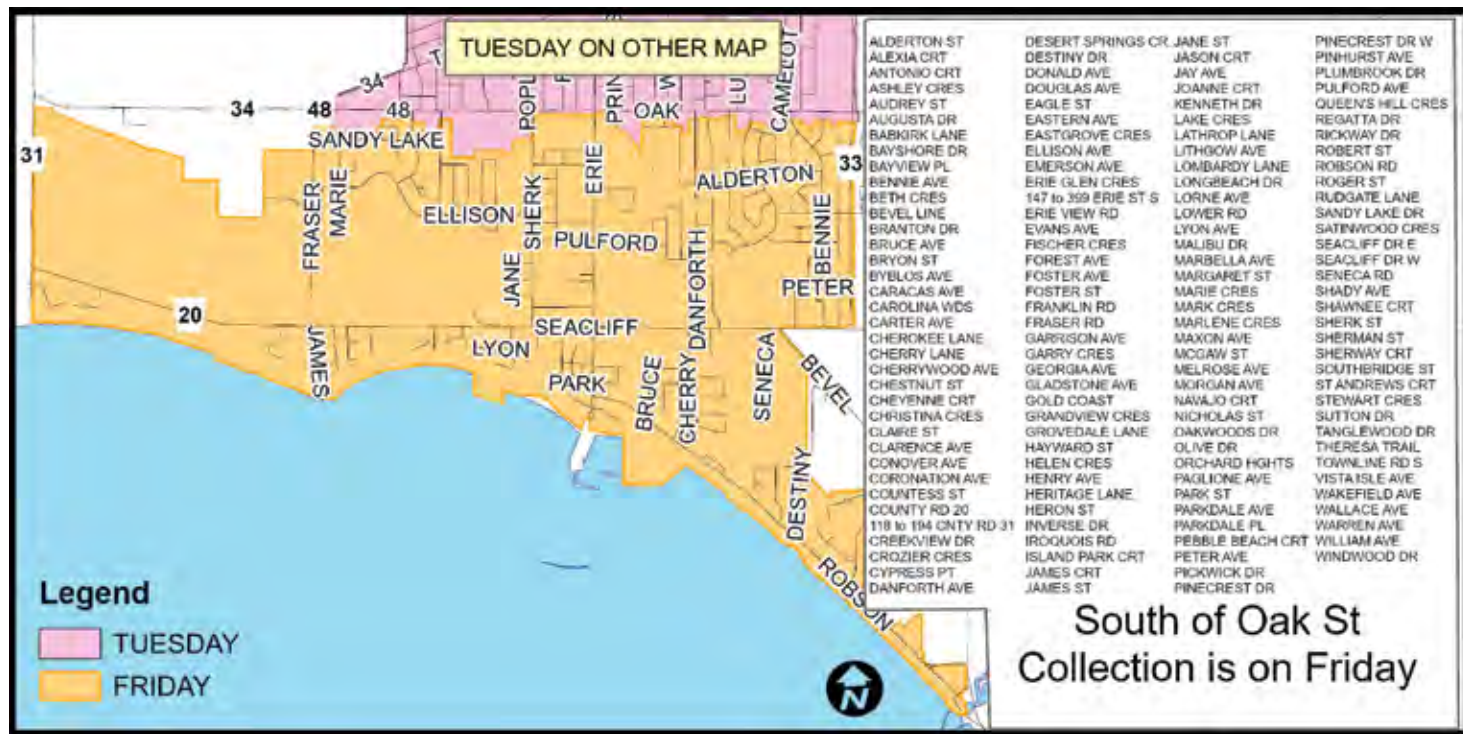

Yard Waste Collection Guide

Basic Collection Requirements (Urban Collection Only)

What is Yard Waste? Yard waste includes grass, leaves, garden trimmings, brush, and branches.

Collection Schedule:

- **When:** Every week from April 8 to November 27, 2026.
- **Check your collection day** using the provided map.

Collection Limits:

- **Maximum:** 4 bags or containers, each weighing up to 20 kg (45 lbs).
- **Acceptable Containers:**
 - Paper yard waste bags
 - Cardboard boxes
 - Garbage cans/pails
- **Not Accepted:**
 - Plastic bags (regular or eco-friendly)
 - Cut-up plastic barrels

Christmas Tree Collection

Christmas trees will be chipped and composted. Please remove all decorations, tree skirts, and plastic bags.

Yard Waste Preparation (Urban Collection Only)

Tree and Hedge Trimmings:

- Bundle tied trimmings (max. length: 4 ft; max. diameter: 2 ft)

Garden Waste (Leaves, Grass Clippings, etc.):

- Use cardboard boxes, paper yard waste bags, or garbage pails/cans.

November Leaf Collection:

- Public Works will pick up leaves from boulevards as scheduled. For pickup dates, call 519-326-5761 or visit leamington.ca/Garbage.
- **Important:** Do not sweep leaves onto the street; it is unlawful and unsafe.

Large Trees and Shrubs:

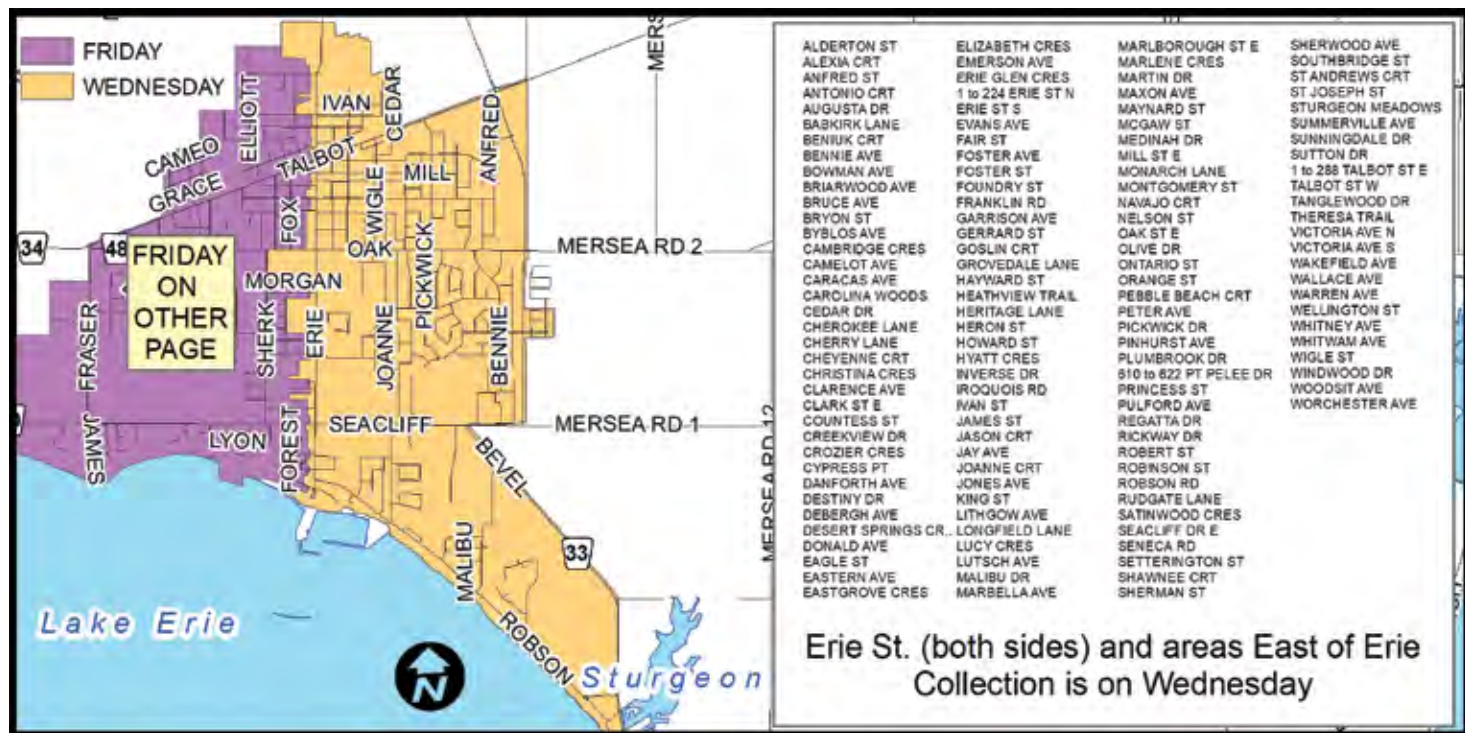
- The Municipality does not collect large trees or shrubs. Regular collection will accept branches and brush up to 3" in diameter if bundled (max. 4 ft by 2 ft, and under 45 lbs).
- Larger items can be dropped off at the Public Drop Off Depot on County Road 31 (Albuna Townline).

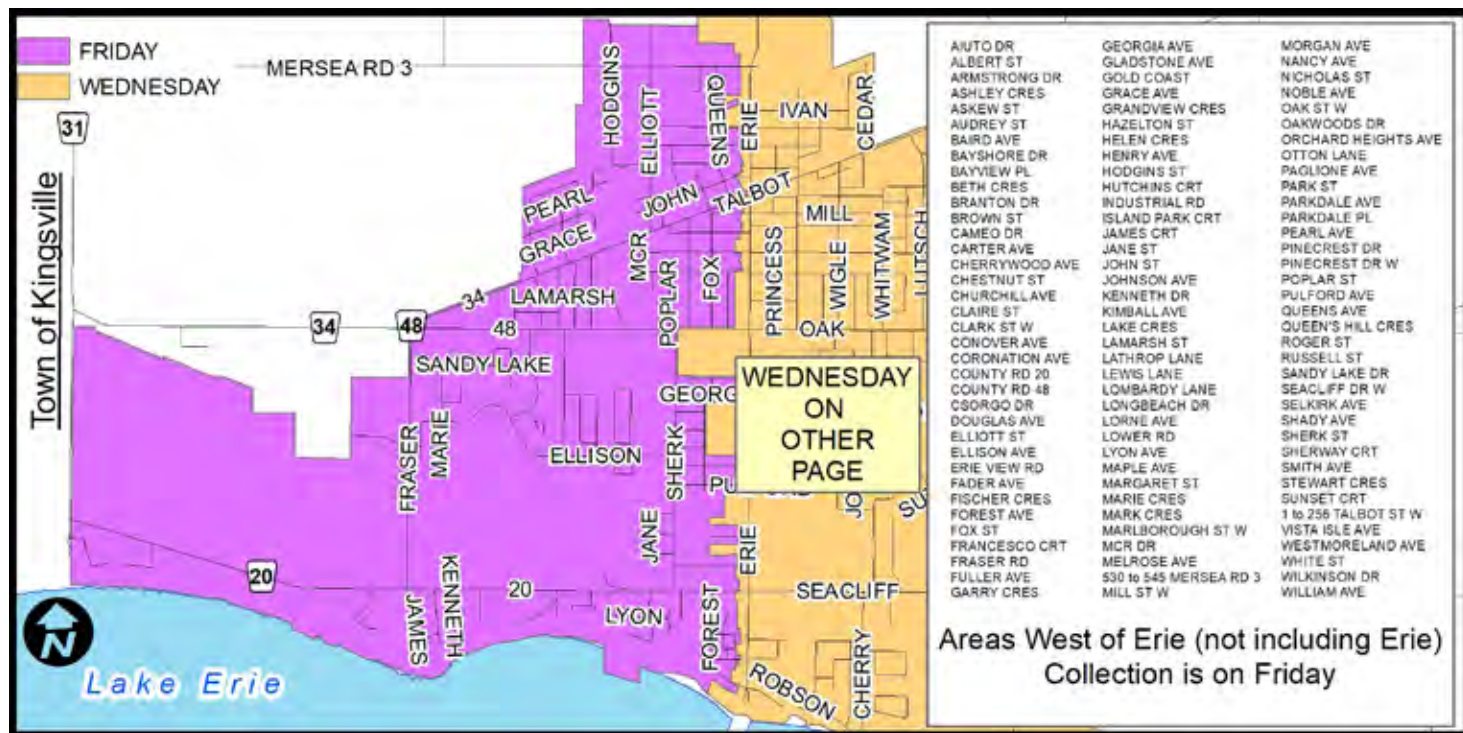

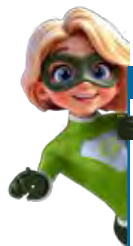

* **Park** the Bin about 30 cm (1 ft) behind the curb.

* **Point** the arrows on the Bin to the street.

* **Space** the Bin at least 1 metre apart from other carts or structures.
