How to read a water meter:

A water meter is a device that records your water usage. The water meter ensures each customer is billed only for the water they use.



Think you have a leak?

Follow the steps outlined below:

- Locate your water meter.
- 2. Turn off all taps inside & outside the building.
- 3. Check the meter. Watch the meter for a minute or more. If the low-flow indicator is moving, you have a leak.

If you find a leak, contact a licensed plumber

Hydrant Reflectors

Installing reflective, colour-coded markers on fire hydrants not only distinguishes them at night from other street level markers but, indicates the gallons per minute flow so crews can hook up appropriate hoses without wasting time checking files.

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS: All food waste (cooked, raw, bones, shells, nuts, rinds, pits and peels) is ACCEPTED in the Green Bin.

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS: Food-soiled paper products are accepted in the Green Bin. Some examples:

GARBAGE COLLECTION

You will receive a WEEKLY garbage collection. Your garbage collection day is THURSDAY. Your garbage day will be identified by a garbage can symbol.

- Place GARBAGE out for collection, Wednesday night. The contractor commences garbage pick up at 4:00 a.m. on Thursday morning.
- Items such as boxsprings, mattresses, couches, chairs, and similar materials can be put out any regular garbage day.
- Do NOT place yard waste out for garbage collection. It will NOT be picked up.
- If you have questions regarding your garbage collection (i.e. what is acceptable) please call Green For Life (GFL) at 519-944-8009.
- Unacceptable Garbage Containers: Do not place garbage out in containers that are: Oversized & Overweight: Containers cannot weigh over 20 kg / 45 lbs. Plastic Shopping Bags: Do NOT place them at the curb. Cardboard Boxes: Recycle or use for Yard Waste!
- Televisions & Computer Equipment: Are NO longer considered garbage and will NOT be collected with regular garbage collection. These items can be dropped off FREE of charge at the Public Drop Off Depots (see Index).
- NON Collectable Waste: Waste that is deemed non-collectable includes: COMPUTER EQUIPMENT, TELEVISIONS, explosives, RENOVATION DEBRIS, animal waste, chemical / paint products, medical waste, syringes, tires, and concrete / bricks. These Items are NOT GARBAGE and will NOT be collected.
- White Goods: A MONTHLY collection of white goods is provided (i.e. metal items, hot water tanks, bbqs, sinks, fridges, ranges, etc.). To arrange for white goods collection, please call Tecumseh Town Hall at 519-735-2184 Ext. 142. There is NO charge for this service.

URBAN AREAS

Acceptable Garbage Containers:

In URBAN areas only,







Plastic bags are NO longer accepted as garbage containers in URBAN areas. (Please refer to map below)

1. A rigid metal or plastic container having:

- a. External handles and a watertight lid:
- b. A lid which is readily separable from the container;
- C. A capacity of not more than 125 L (33 gallons);
- d. An external height no greater than 100 centimeters (39 inches);
- An internal width or diameter no greater than 50 centimeters (20 inches); and
- A diameter at the top equal to or greater than the diameter at the bottom.
- An approved Roll-out Cart with a 340 L (90 gallon) capacity that is compatible with the collection equipment.

Tip: Put drainage holes in the bottom of your container to allow liquids to drain out.

Do NOT use barrels or plastic bags for garbage cans.



RURAL AREAS

Acceptable Garbage Containers:

In RURAL areas only, please refer to map on left.









1. A rigid metal or plastic container having:

- a. External handles and a watertight lid;
- b. A lid which is readily separable from the container;
- C. A capacity of not more than 125 L (33 gallons);
- d. An external height no greater than 100 centimeters (39 inches);
- An internal width or diameter no greater than 50 centimeters (20 inches); and
- A diameter at the top equal to or greater than the diameter at the bottom.
- 2. A polyethylene or other plastic bag with a minimum thickness of 1.2 mil that can withstand a weight of 22.7 kilograms (50 pounds) without tearing, and measuring approximately 65 cm to 90 cm (26 in x 36 in) and properly sealed, having a tied top.
- An approved Roll-out Cart with a 340 L (90 gallon) capacity that is compatible with the collection equipment.

Tip: Put drainage holes in the bottom of your container to allow liquids to drain out.

Do NOT use barrels for garbage cans.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Basic Collection Requirements:

- Yard Waste Collection will be provided every MONDAY from April 6, 2026, up to and including November 30, 2026.
- The contractor will commence pick up at 4:00 a.m. Yard Waste should be placed out for collection Sunday night.
- Yard Waste in plastic bags will NOT be collected.

The only ACCEPTABLE CONTAINERS

for Yard Waste are:

- · Paper Yard Waste Bags
- Cardboard Boxes
- · Garbage Cans / Pails

No Plastic Bags for Yard Waste!



Please check the Town's website (www.tecumseh.ca) for any changes to Garbage & Yard Waste Collection services.

Yard Waste Preparation:

Yard Waste is defined as grass, leaves, garden trimmings, brush & branches, etc.

Tree / Hedge Trimmings:

Cut in 4 ft. lengths (max. diameter 2 ft.) and bundle securely. Not to exceed 45 lbs.

Large tree trunks or stumps will NOT be picked up.

Vegetation / Garden Waste:

Flowers, vegetable plants and fruit should be put in acceptable containers for collection (remove soil from roots).

Christmas Trees:

Remove ornaments, bags and stands.





 Look for the Paper Yard Waste Bag (symbol). It will indicate the date of your Yard Waste Collection Day.



Pest Control - Dealing With Rodents

Pests: What is a Pest?

A pest, as defined by the Federal Pest Control Products Act, means "an animal, a plant or other organism that is injurious, noxious or troublesome, whether directly or indirectly, and an injurious, noxious or troublesome condition or organic function of an animal, a plant or other organism."

There are many common pests including rodents (rats and mice), moles, skunks, raccoons, etc. There are easy ways to both identify whether you might have pests and ways to prevent them from living or returning to your property.

Where Am I Most Likely to Find Rodents on my Property?

Rodents are pests that are found year round. Rodents typically live outdoors and then migrate inside when cool weather approaches. They are found around buildings, in gardens, near garbage or composters, and within homes, including in the roof and in drains.

Rodents are nocturnal animals, meaning that they are most active at night. However, if food and water sources are scarce, or if large infestations occur, rodents will become active during the day.

Preventing Rodents

There are several simple steps you can take to prevent rodents on your property:

Remove Clutter

- This is an important step as clutter gives rodents lots of places to hide, sleep, nest and reproduce.
- Remove (and recycle) piles of newspapers, paper bags, cardboard and bottles.
- · Clear out your basement and yard.
- Try to store items away from walls and off the ground.



Maintain Your Yard

- Control weeds, shrubs and bushes as pests are often found in burrows under bushes and plants.
- · Keep tall grass, bushes, shrubs and mulch away from building foundations.
- · Make space between plants and avoid dense planting.
- · Keep gardens free of weeds and trash.

Manage Your Garbage

- · Bring garbage cans and bags to the curb as close to pick-up time as possible.
- · Use hard plastic or metal cans with tight fitting lids.
- · Always put garbage inside pest proof containers with tight fitting lids.
- · If you compost, remember to follow good composting practices:
 - . Do not throw food scraps into backyard compost without covering them.
 - Have a pest proof compost container.

Keep Food Away


- . Do not put food out for stray cats, pigeons or squirrels.
- · Remove fallen fruit and nuts from your yard.
- · Remove pet food right after feeding and do not leave it outside overnight.
- Clean out waste and food from pet enclosures.
- Equip bird feeders with trays and clean spilled seeds often.
- Repair any plumbing leaks to remove a water source, and remember to always cover pools when not in use.

Eliminate Potential Hiding and Living Places

- Trim plants near buildings so that 15 to 20 cm (6 to 8 inches) above ground is clear. Trim branches of trees or shrubs to prevent access to roofs or balconies.
- · Remove unused piles of lumber and old sheds.
- · Do not store old cars or furniture outside.
- · Store lumber and firewood on stands high-off the ground.

Keep Rodents Out (Pest-Proofing Your Home)

- . Be sure to seal cracks and smalls holes (usually with caulk).
- · Close gaps under doors with rodent-resistant metal door sweeps.
- · Close window gaps with metal flashing.
- · Put screens on vents, especially on lower floors.

Building Permits:

Permits are required for the construction, alteration and extension of buildings and structures including pools, fences, decks and accessory buildings (sheds, garages). Permits are also required for the alteration to the grade of your property. For further information, please visit tecumseh.ca/building.

Cloudpermit:

The Cloudpermit building permit system is user-friendly, efficient, and allows residents, builders, and businesses to apply for and to see the status of an application from anywhere, at any time. Users can log into Cloudpermit from any mobile device to apply for a permit, track their permit and inspection status, and communicate with the Town's building department and all involved parties with easy-to-follow messages, Visit tecumseh.ca/cloudpermit for more information!

Additional Residential Units:


Additional Residential Units (ARUs) are self-contained residential units with kitchen and bathroom facilities within a single detached, semi-detached or townhouse dwelling or within a detached building on the same lot as the primary residential dwelling.

The Town's Zoning By-laws permit ARUs on land zoned residential subject to meeting prescribed regulations pertaining to setbacks, size/height, lot coverage, services, parking and ERCA requirements. To introduce an ARU within the Town's agricultural areas, a site-specific Zoning By-law Amendment (ZBA) is required. For information regarding the ZBA process, please contact the Development Services Department at 519.735.2184 ext. 123. Please note that the construction of an ARU must meet the Ontario Building Code and a building permit application and plans must be submitted to the Town of Tecumseh Building Department for review and approval.


















Only YOU Can Prevent Cooking Fires



Cooking left unattended

is a leading cause of home fires in Ontario.

Install smoke and carbon monoxide alarms on every storey of your home. Test them every month.



How do I keep myself and my loved ones safe?

To prevent cooking fires, you must **be alert**. You will not be alert if you are sleepy, have consumed alcohol, drugs or medicine that makes you drowsy.

Always stay in the kitchen while cooking. If you must leave, turn off the stove.

Keep anything that burns - oven mitts, cooking utensils, dish cloths, paper towels and pot holders

-a safe distance from the stove.

Keep a **proper-fitting pot lid** near the stove when cooking. If a pot catches fire slide the lid over the pot and turn off the stove. Do not move the pot until it has cooled completely.

Loose-fitting clothes can come into contact with stove burners and catch fire. Wear short sleeves, tight sleeves or roll them up when cooking.














Winter Safety

Mailboxes Damaged by Snowplows

During winter snow clearing operations, the Town of Tecumseh will only assume responsibility for mailboxes that are damaged by the snowplows. We do NOT replace or repair mailboxes that are:

- · damaged by thrown snow
- in poor condition as a result of age or vandalism
- non-compliant with the Town's installation specifications

Who determines which streets get plowed first?

The Town of Tecumseh follows the provincially prescribed standards for winter maintenance. The standard for clearing snow accumulation and treating ice from the roadway is based on the class of the roadway and the amount of snow and ice accumulation.

The following are the various road classifications in order of priority:

- Class 1 CR 22 (under the jurisdiction of the County of Essex)
- Class 2 Tecumseh Road, Manning Road
- Class 3 Lesperance Road, Riverside Drive, North Talbot Road
- Class 4 Lacasse Boulevard, St. Thomas Street, St. Gregory Street, South Talbot Road
- Class 5 Local residential roads i.e. Gauthier, Kensington Boulevard, Hebert Street

Class 6 - Cul-de-sacs


Why does the snowplow leave a windrow at the end of my driveway?

Plow operators do not intentionally block driveways with snow. The plows have limited control over the amount and direction of snow that comes off the plow. When you are clearing the end of your driveway, please pile the snow on the right side (standing in your driveway and looking towards the street).

What is a windrow?

A snow windrow is the pile of snow that accumulates at the end of driveways when the

road is plowed.





WINTER GREEN BIN TIPS

Using the Green Bin all year makes a big difference.

Winter can be tricky, but following a few simple tips will help you stay green during the colder months.



TIPS TO PREVENT FREEZING

The Bottom Line? Line The Bottom!

Line the bottom of the Green Bin with food-soiled paper products or packaging such as egg cartons, takeout cartons, etc.

The Early Bird Doesn't Freeze.

If possible, set the Green Bin out **the morning of collection day by 6 a.m.,** not the night before.

Protect Your Bin - Bring It In.

Store the Green Bin in a garage or shed - or place it against an outside wall - to protect it from snow, ice and extreme temperatures.

TIPS FOR SET-OUT

Don't Bank On It!

Snowbanks can make it harder to set out the Green Bin. Be sure to place the Green Bin on a cleared, level area on your property along the street— never on top of snowbanks. Remember: always try to use **Park-Point-Space.**
